The Program for Avocational Archaeological Certification (PAAC) is a training program in basic archaeological skills. PAAC was established as a joint effort between the Colorado Archaeological Society (CAS) and the Office of the State Archaeologist (OSAC). The program, through OSAC, provides professional training to interested citizens of Colorado and recognizes the satisfactory completion of program requirements by issuing certificates of expertise.

Archaeological survey and laboratory are the main topics of the PAAC program. The topics are divided into a series of modules, each having a defined curriculum leading to certification. A module's curriculum includes courses, examinations, and practical field/laboratory work. Certification is granted by the PAAC Board to participants satisfactorily completing a module's curriculum. The PAAC Board is composed of the Board Chairperson, a CAS member; the CAS President; and the State Archaeologist.

PAAC-trained people are a concerned group of volunteers who want to take an active role in the preservation of Colorado's cultural resources. They have expressed a real interest in becoming volunteers on cultural resource projects sponsored by both private industry and government agencies.

It should be understood that program participants are not professional archaeologists and are not in competition with the professional community. The use of PAAC-trained volunteers for contracted projects or projects that could have been contracted out is in opposition to the policies of the program. Furthermore, participants work as volunteers, receiving no wages/salaries other than possible expense reimbursement.

Enclosed are the definitions of program status and a list of PAAC-trained individuals. These individuals are recommended by the PAAC Board as potential cultural resource volunteers. Individuals and their status in the program are listed by CAS chapter affiliation. Chapter presidents will serve as contacts for volunteer recruiting.

STATUS DEFINITIONS

Certification Candidate (CC): completed the first two courses of the Provisional Surveyor module; not certified.

**Has a basic knowledge of field techniques and cultural history.

Limited amount of field experience.

Courses: Basic Site Surveying Techniques (25 hrs.)
Colorado Archaeology (20 hrs.)

Provisional Surveyor (PS): certified

**Has a basic knowledge of survey techniques and cultural history.

Can adequately record both prehistoric and historic sites.

Courses: Archaeological Practice in Colorado (8 hrs.)
Basic Site Surveying Techniques (25 hrs.)
Colorado Archaeology (20 hrs.)
Historical Archaeology (20 hrs.)

Experience: Recorded four sites, historic and prehistoric, on standard Colorado forms.

Certified Surveyor I (CS I): certified; must first be a certified Provisional Surveyor.

**Has a working knowledge of survey techniques and artifact identification.

Courses: Prehistoric Lithic Description and Analysis (20 hrs.)
Prehistoric Ceramic Description and Analysis (20 hrs.)
Perishable Material (20 hrs.)

Experience: Crew member on two surveys for a minimum total of 15 days field work.

Certified Surveyor II (CS II): certified; must first be both a certified Provisional Surveyor and Certified Surveyor I.

**Has experience in report preparation and a basic knowledge of dating methods and photography.

Courses: Research Design and Report Writing (15 hrs.)
Archaeological Dating Methods (12 hrs.)
Field and Laboratory Photography (12 hrs.)

Experience: Designed, carried out, and submitted a written report on intensive survey of a defined area or defined problem.

Laboratory (L): certified Trainee (**L I**) and certified Technician (**L II**).

**Has a working knowledge of laboratory techniques and procedures.

Courses: Archaeological Practice in Colorado (8 hrs.)
Archaeological Laboratory Techniques (15 hrs.)
Colorado Archaeology (20 hrs.)
Prerequisite courses as needed, such as Lithics or Historical Archaeology

Experience: 40 (L I) to 80 (L II) hours in a working laboratory.

Scholar (SC): certified

**Has basic knowledge of cultural history, survey and lab techniques, artifact identification, report preparation, dating methods and photography. Limited amount of field experience.

Courses: successful completion of all 13 courses in the program.

Specialty Surveyor (SS): certified

**Specialist within a defined area of study. Independent effort has led to certification in Public Education, Designation of Properties to the National Register, Rock Art Studies or some other specialized field.

Courses: Archaeological Practice in Colorado (8 hrs.)
Basic Site Surveying Techniques (25 hrs.)
Colorado Archaeology (20 hrs.)
Rock Art Studies (20 hrs.)

LATEST NEWS: Twelve PAAC certificates were awarded in 2011, the announcements being made at the quarterly and annual meetings of the Colorado Archaeological Society (CAS). This past year, five PAAC volunteers received certificates at the quarterly meeting of CAS on January 22, 2011 in Pueblo. Dennis and Wendy Schiferl (Pueblo chapter) each received the Laboratory Trainee certificate; while Ann Sanger (Pikes Peak chapter) and Barbara and Carl Haberland (Pueblo chapter) were awarded PAAC Scholar certificates. Three more PAAC Scholar certificates were awarded at the CAS quarterly meeting in Dolores on July 23, 2011 to Mary Ann Gabriel and Robert Rushforth (both of the Denver chapter), and to Patrice Gibson (Indian Peaks chapter). Finally, three volunteers earned four more certificates in the third quarter, which were presented at the CAS annual meeting in Boulder on October 15, 2011. Mary Ann Gabriel (Denver chapter) received two certificates: Provisional Surveyor and Certified Surveyor I; Katherine McComb (Indian Peaks chapter) also was recognized at the Certified Surveyor I level; and Bonnie Moser (Pikes Peak chapter) was awarded the PAAC Scholar certificate.

The good news continues into the new year with three more PAAC certificates being awarded at the CAS quarterly meeting in Denver on January 21, 2012.
