Rainbow Arch Bridge

Constructed in 1923, the Rainbow Arch Bridge spans the South Platte River in Fort Morgan, Colorado. The bridge is listed on the National Register of Historic Places as a Colorado Civil Engineering Landmark due to its unique concrete arch design. The recently rehabilitated Rainbow Arch is presently used as a pedestrian and cyclist crossing, and serves as the entrance to the Pawnee Pioneer Trails Scenic and Historic Byway.
