Vandals thoughtlessly defaced this ancient petroglyph panel with bullets and paint, and attempted to remove a pecked figure by cutting at its margins. The Bureau of Land Management, Friends of Canyon Pintado and other partners developed a trail system and interpretive programs that have virtually eliminated additional vandalism here and at other important regional sites.
