

COLORADO RAILROAD COMPANY – MSS 805

The Colorado Railroad Company was incorporated in 1906 by Denver investors through whom control of the Colorado Railroad Company passed to the Colorado & Southern. The original plan for the Colorado Railroad Company called for the construction of a rail network through the northern agricultural and coal lands, and into and through the mountains. In reality, Colorado Railroad track consisted mainly of spurs connected by Colorado and Southern routes.

The Colorado Railroad Company took over the Fort Collins Development Railroad (1907) and the Walsenburg & Western (18910) for the Colorado & Southern. In 1930 the railroad ceased to be operated under lease to the Colorado & Southern, and was merged with the Colorado and Southern.
