**Internship Title:** Women's History Museum Internship

**Internship Location:** Center for Colorado Women's History in Denver, CO

*Qualified candidates may receive academic credit through their college or university.*

**Desired Schedule:** Monday, Friday, Saturday, and/or Sunday availability, from June to August, 2021 (minimum 6/hours per week)

**Broad Scope of Position:** The Center for Colorado Women's History focuses on scholarship, research, lectures, tours and exhibits that expand the understanding and collective memory of the history of women in Colorado. During this internship, the intern will assist museum staff with providing tours of the historic home and visitor services at the front desk. Additionally, the intern will assist with virtual program planning and implementation, research and collection of information about the historic house and women's history topics, and connect local stories to the broader stories of women's history worldwide.

**Outcomes:** The intern will gain experience with public speaking, working with other volunteers and visitors, gain knowledge of museum work, and learn about the operations of a small museum. This internship also provides the chance to gain confidence and experience as a tour guide and with public programs.

**Desired Skills & Academic Field of Study:** History Colorado is seeking a student in history, public history, historic preservation, hospitality, museum studies, or other related fields.
