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A GUIDE TO THE COLLECTION

This collection consists of three parts, the first being the records and correspondence of Attorney A. Watson McHendrie in various water law cases. The second part is the correspondence and related material dealing with the Arkansas Valley Ditch Association. In addition to its involvement in the Colorado-Kansas suit, there is a great deal of material on the Caddoa Dam. The third part contains printed material and maps.

As Secretary of the AVDA and partner in the law firm McHendrie, Shattuck & Pointer, Vena Pointer is a central figure in the correspondence of this collection. There are many men deeply involved in the water problems of the Arkansas Valley, as well as those of Colorado. In addition to those already mentioned, the following appear frequently: R. J. Tipton, Special Engineer, State of Colorado; Arthur C. Gordon, Lamar attorney and member of the Caddoa Dam Committee; Congressman John A. Martin; Arthur Dean of Las Animas, President of Caddoa Reservoir & Arkansas River Basis Conservancy & Improvement District; U. S. Senator Alva B. Adams; and Ray McGrath, President of the Caddoa Reservoir Association.

FOREWORD

The Arkansas Valley Ditch Association was organized in 1901 in order to help the State of Colorado provide the defense in the first (and subsequent) Kansas vs. Colorado case over the division of the Arkansas River waters. Members of this association were certain of the major ditches on the Arkansas River between Pueblo and the Kansas state line. They represented 228,000 acres of irrigated land out of approximately 500,000 acres of irrigated land in the Arkansas River Basin in Colorado. Other contributors to the defense fund were several counties of the Arkansas River Basin and an organization called the Arkansas Valley Protective Association, organized in 1923 after the fourth interstate suit was started. The fifth suit was filed in 1929 in the U. S. Supreme Court. Kansas at this time asked that 50% of all water of the Arkansas and its tributaries be delivered to Kansas at the state line. At the time of the filing of Colorado vs. Kansas, William L. Boatright was Attorney General of Colorado; A. W. McHendrie, James Grafton Rogers and Fred A. Sabin were local counsel in the case. Henry C. Vidal succeeded Mr. Sabin after the latter's death in 1931. M. C. Hinderlider was State Engineer.

As time went on, the AVDA found itself interested in all aspects of water that affected the Arkansas River Basin. The Association tried to develop additional useful water through storage, flood control and transmountain diversion projects. Thus, it was very closely involved in the efforts to obtain the Caddoa Dam. Not only would the dam bring storage and flood control benefits, but it was felt that the division of the stored water between Kansas and Colorado could serve as a basis for settling the Colorado-Kansas dispute.

A number of attempts were made to have the dam financed by various government agencies established under the New Deal of the 1930s. The money finally came from the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, who built the dam as a flood control project. Construction started in 1939, but was interrupted during World War II. Work was resumed in 1946, and the dam was completed in October, 1948. The project was renamed the John Martin Reservoir in 1940, after the congressman from that district who had done so much to get it approved.

The Colorado-Kansas Compact on the Arkansas River was executed in 1949 and provided for an administrative committee to operate the Caddoa Reservoir, thus ending nearly 50 years of litigation between the two states.

PROVENANCE

The material in this collection was given in 1968 to the Western Business History Research Center for the Library of the State Historical Society of Colorado. This gift was made jointly by the Southeastern Colorado Water Conservancy District and by the Arkansas Valley Ditch Association. It was through the efforts of Mr. Phillip A. Danielson of the law firm Holland & Hart, with the help of Mr. Charles Thomsom, Manager of the Southeastern Colorado Water Conservancy District and Mr. Lloyd Barnhart, Secretary-Treasurer of the Arkansas Valley Ditch Association, that this donation came about. There are approximately 6,000 items of correspondence, legal records and other material.

CHRONOLOGY

- 1901 State of Kansas vs. State of Colorado was brought to the U. S. Supreme Court; decided in 1907. Arkansas Valley Ditch Association was established.
- 1910 The second suit in the litigation between Kansas and Colorado, United States Irrigation Co. vs. Graham Ditch Co. et al, was brought in the Circuit Court of the U. S. for the District of Colorado. A cash settlement was made.
- 1916 The third suit in the litigation between Kansas and Colorado was brought in the U. S. District Court for the District of Colorado by the Finney County Water Users Association against primarily the same defendants as in the second suit.
- 1923 The fourth suit was brought by the Finney County Water Users Association in the U. S. District Court for the District of Colorado against water users located principally on tributaries of the Arkansas, including the cities of Walsenburg and Trinidad, the town of La Veta, the Colorado Fuel and Iron Co., and various irrigation interests. The Arkansas Valley Protective Association was organized after the institution of the fourth interstate suit. It lasted about seven years and cooperated with the Arkansas Valley Ditch Association.
- 1927 Colorado brought suit against Kansas and prayed that prosecution of the two suits by the Finney County Water Users Association be enjoined and the whole controversy settled as between the states.
- 1928 Preliminary survey of the Caddoa site was made by the State Engineer.
- 6-33 Local interests begin promotion of Caddoa's construction as a federal project. Caddoa Dam Committee is formed.
- 10-3-33 Colorado application was filed with Public Works Administration for construction of Caddoa Dam and Reservoir as a purely federal project.

- 11-3-33 Caddoa project is presented to the Mississippi River Commission, which is charged with preparing programs embracing the Mississippi and all its tributaries.
- 12-7-33 Stipulation providing for division of Caddoa Reservoir water is signed by Colorado and Kansas. This is expected to provide a basis for settling the Colorado-Kansas case.
- 12-19-33 Incorporation papers are filed for Caddoa Reservoir Association to take title, to maintain and to operate reservoir if the government wishes.
- 12-26-33 Arkansas Basin Committee reports to the Mississippi Valley Committee that the Caddoa project is feasible from an engineering viewpoint and is economically sound.
- 1-34 Mississippi Valley Committee presents a favorable report on the Caddoa project to the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works.
- 2-7-34 Kansas makes application to the Public Works Administration for construction of the Caddoa Dam and Reservoir as a purely federal project.
- ca. 2-24-34 PWA turns down the Caddoa Dam, saying the benefits are entirely local in character.
- 6-29-34 The work of the Caddoa Dam Committee is taken over by the Caddoa Reservoir Association, which functions until 5-2-35.
- 8-16-34 Mass meeting is held in Pueblo to promote Caddoa Dam.
- 3-6-35 Application for Caddoa Dam, supplementary to PWA application, is made to U. S. Army Corps of Engineers as an essential flood control unit in Mississippi project.

- 1935 A bill to form Caddoa Reservoir and Arkansas River Basin Conservancy and Improvement District is introduced. This is a legal entity for the purpose of entering into contracts for local participation, i.e., operation and maintenance of the project after completion and possibly for providing rights of way. The Board of Directors is organized on 5-2-35.
- 8-3-35 Army Corps of Engineers approves Caddoa project.
- 11-29-35 Application is made to the Bureau of Reclamation for \$2,500,000 to be used, together with the \$5,250,000 designated as a flood control grant by the Corps of Engineers, for building a reservoir. The \$2,500,000 is to be paid back on a rental basis.
- 6-22-36 Construction of the Dam is authorized by Congress in the Flood Control Act, although no money is appropriated.
- 1937 The Colorado Water Conservation Board is established.
- 1938 The Flood Control Bill provides a 100% federal grant covering not only costs of construction of the Dam, but also rights-of way, relocation of utilities and other expenses.
- 1939 Construction of Caddoa Dam by the Corps of Engineers begins. \$3,300,000 is appropriated for Caddoa.
- 1940 Name of Caddoa Dam is changed to John Martin Dam.
- 1941 \$4,000,000 is appropriated for work in 1942 on Caddoa.
- 1942 An additional \$2,500,000 is appropriated for work in 1943, bring the total to \$13,209,300. This completes the project except for the steel gates.
- 1943 Work on the Dam is suspended due to the war.

1946 Work on the Dam is resumed.

1948 Work on the Dam is completed in October. Operation and maintenance is put under the direction of the Secretary of the Army and supervision of the Corps of Engineers.
