He next moved to Chicago where he worked in the machinery business, and from there he moved to Leadville, Colorado. In Leadville Batchelder became interested in the mining business and purchased mining property in Leadville and Cripple Creek. He was involved in several mining companies, including the Stormy Petrel Mining and Milling Company, the Monica Mining Company, the Emmons Mining Company, and the Bannon Mining Company. He moved to Denver and served as president of the Colorado Mining Exchange during the early days of its organization.
