FOREWORD

Significance - The papers of William Abraham Bell record the business activities of that group of entrepreneurs, who with General William Jackson Palmer, built and operated the Denver and Rio Grande Railway Co., subsidiary and complementary rail lines, and allied enterprises in Colorado, New Mexico, and Utah in the second half of the nineteenth century. An Englishman of wealth and social position, Bell was the agent for obtaining capital in Britain not only for Palmer's numerous business ventures, but also in behalf of other promoters such as Wilson Waddingham of the Maxwell Land Co. and Jerome B. Chaffee, banker and mine owner.

The collection consists of approximately 850 items, of which about 475 are in-coming and out-going correspondence, the remainder are documents related to the more than 30 companies (railroad, land development, townsite, mining, and manufacturing) in which Bell held official positions and large financial interests.

Provenance - The papers of William Abraham Bell were given to The State Historical Society of Colorado by Mr. Bell's heirs. The collection is accessioned with the number 30827 in the 1963-1970 accession book of the Library of The State Historical Society of Colorado.

William Abraham Bell, M.A., M.B., Cantab., was the son of Dr. William Bell, a physician. W.A. Bell was educated for the medical profession, graduating from Trinity Hall, Cambridge, in 1861, after which he studied at St. George's Hospital before receiving the Cambridge Medical Degree in 1864. For the next two years he practiced medicine with his father in the Mayfair district of London.

While in the United States in 1866, Bell learned that the Kansas Pacific Railway Co. and the U.S. government were planning a survey of railroad routes from Kansas to the Pacific Ocean. Through the efforts of Dr. John LeConte, a Philadelphia geologist who was a member of the party, Bell was offered the position of photographer. After the medical officer, Dr. Lewis, left the expedition, Bell took over the duties of physician. The party assembled at Salina, Kansas, and from there, on June 7, 1867, commenced an overland trek to Fort Lyon, Colorado Territory, where one group, including Bell, ascended the Purgatoire River, crossed the Raton Mountains to Albuquerque, then pressed westward to the Pacific along the 32nd parallel. In the course of the long journey Bell developed a close friendship with General William J. Palmer, Secretary-Treasurer of the Kansas Pacific and commander of the survey party.

Bell returned to England in 1868 to write an account of his experiences in the Southwest. New Tracks in North America: A Journal of Travel and Adventure Whilst Engaged in the Survey of a Southern Railroad to the Pacific Ocean during 1867-1868 (2 vols.), published in London in 1869, prominently identified Bell with the American West in the eyes of many Englishmen.

In 1870, Bell returned to the United States to join with Palmer and others in constructing the Denver & Rio Grande Railway from Denver to Colorado Springs, with an ultimate goal of El Paso, Texas. The railroad pushed southward to Pueblo and El Moro (near Trinidad), extended westward to La Veta, Alamosa, and Durango, and from Pueblo to Canon City and later Leadville. For many years a vice president of the company, Bell was also an important agent for placing in England and on the Continent securities and bonds of Palmer's numerous business ventures.

As the D&RG built throughout much of southern Colorado, Bell emerged as a leading founder of towns and a variety of business enterprises. In partnership with Palmer, A.C. Hunt, and other officials of the railway, Bell acquired vast tracts in advance of the railroad. Town companies were established at South Pueblo, El Moro, La Veta, Garland, and Durango. Coal mines were opened in Fremont, Huertano, Las Animas, Gunnison, and La Plata Counties; iron mines were operated in Sangre de Cristo Mountains near Villa Grove, Saguache County, and on the Trinchera Estate. In 1880, Bell and Palmer were the principal organizers of The Colorado Coal & Iron Co. at Bessemer (South Pueblo), manufacturers of steel rails and operator of coal mines. Bell was also one of the chief promoters of The Anthracite Mesa Coal Mining Co. with a mine at Crested Butte; The Porter Coal Co. with mines near Durango; and The Pleasant Valley Coal Co. with mines in Utah. With John A. Porter, Bell organized the San Juan & New York Mining & Smelting Co., and the two men held at one time substantial interests in the Mendota, Sheridan, Smuggler, and Union mines at Telluride.

In 1872, the year that the D&RG Railway reached Pueblo, General Palmer, with Bell's assistance, secured the first of the so-called Palmer-Sullivan concessions from Mexico, including the right to construct rail lines from Mexico City to El Paso and to the Pacific Ocean. Bell was instrumental in marketing in England securities and bonds for the Mexican National Railway Co. and the Mexican National Construction Co.

Bell also joined Palmer in constructing the Denver & Rio Grande Western Railway Co., linking Colorado and Utah. Large coal mines were opened by The Pleasant Valley Coal Co. to provide the railroad with fuel and traffic. Col. David C. Dodge and George Foster Peabody, founder and partner of Spencer Trask & Co., a New York banking firm, were also prominently associated with the Utah enterprises. In 1901, Palmer and associates sold the D&RG to the D&RG Railroad Co. for about \$6 million, about one-sixth of which was distributed to veteran employees.

After residing in Manitou, Colorado, for thirty years, Bell, in 1901, returned to his native land. He spent the remainder of his life at Pendell Court, his family residence at Blechingley in Surrey, where he died in 1921, survived by his widow, one son, and three daughters.
