On Feb. 19, 1942, President Franklin Roosevelt signed Executive Order 9066, which led to the incarceration of 120,000 Japanese Americans during WWII. Each year, Mile High JACL hosts a Day of Remembrance event to mark that dark chapter of US history.

On Sunday Feb. 16 from 1-3 pm at History Colorado Center, join us for keynote speaker Mitch Maki, CEO of the Go For Broke National Education Center in Los Angeles, who will pay tribute to the heroes of the Military Intelligence Service, or MIS. These Nisei soldiers were not famous like the “Go For Broke” 442nd Regimental Combat Team in Europe, but they were instrumental in the allied victory in the Pacific, and in the U.S. Occupation postwar Japan.

Parking: covered facilities directly across the street at 12th Avenue and Broadway. Street parking in Denver is free on Sundays. Wheelchair accessible entrance is on the 12th Avenue, east of Broadway.
